CCR has to be on city hall's paper head, signed and stamped.</p> <p>CCR can be done in most consulates / embassies in Morocco. Check with your destination agent before departure.</p>
<b>Diplomats' removals</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Franchising delivered by Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Rabat (in French)</li> <li>• Inventory in French or Arabic.</li> <li>• Copy of passport.</li> </ul>	Duty free entry even for new furniture. <a href="#">For alcohol, see under the wine/alcohol section.</a>	
<b>Wedding trousseaux</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Wedding certificate.</li> <li>• Original certificate of change of residence.</li> <li>• Inventory in French or Arabic.</li> <li>• Proof of residence in Morocco for your husband/wife.</li> </ul>	Duty free entry except for new items.	
<b>Inheritance</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Notary act giving name of the deceased and his family relationship with the heir.</li> <li>• Inventory delivered by notary.</li> <li>• Copy of heir's passport.</li> </ul>	Same as above.

<b>Motor vehicles, motor cycles, boats, caravans</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Original of title certificate.</li> <li>Original passport.</li> </ul>	<p>1 / Diplomats Free entry with franchising letter Whether used or new car.</p> <p>2 / Non diplomats</p> <p>21 – temporary import Free if car is less than 5 years old Temporary import is limited to 6 months per calendar year.</p> <p>22 – regular import Around 50 % taxes and duties Car has to be less than 5 years old.</p>	Only diplomats can import a car older than 5 year's old

Wine, alcohol		<p>25 to 30 bottles admitted as “fond de cave” if part of your removal.</p> <p><i>What is allowed for a foreigner:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 15 “opened” bottles (e.g. opened whisky bottle) + 15 unopened bottles.</li> <li>• Indicate ‘fond de cave’ on the packing list.</li> </ul> <p><i>What is allowed for a diplomat:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 19 boxes of alcohol (pack of 6 or 12 bottles).</li> <li>• Indicate ‘fond de cave’ on the packing list.</li> </ul>	Bottles shouldn’t be in new cases. They have to be bought some time ago.
Narcotics, drugs		Prohibited entry.	
Tins & food		Small quantities admitted as part of removal goods.
